CS: Lego League Robotics Class, Ages 9-14

This is a beginning and continuing robotics Workshop utilizing the latest Lego Mindstorm system - Spike Prime Robotics platform and Lego Technic materials. This course aims to introduce the student to basic beginning programming and problem-solving strategies and design, develop, and compete in robotic activities and challenges. This workshop will involve students in developing, building, and programming a Lego Spike Prime robot using Scratch-like Lego programming - a blocked-based visual programming coding language.

Students will work hands-on in teams to design, build, and program. This class will also encourage teamwork and collaboration in groups and teams. Topics may include motor controls, gear ratios, basic engineering concepts, use of sensors, timing, programming loops, design process, and decision-making. Student-designed robots will be programmed to compete in various in-class challenges as developed by FIRST Lego League (FLL). This class should provide motivation and a base for students to continue in computer science and engineering classes.

Introduction to American Civics Course Description

This course examines civics as the systematic study of constitutional government, political institutions, public law, and civic agency. Students will analyze how authority is constituted, distributed, limited, and contested within the American political system. Emphasis is placed on constitutional structure, institutional design, democratic theory, and the relationship between citizens and the state.

The course integrates primary-source analysis, doctrinal case study, comparative institutional examination, and applied policy evaluation. Students will interpret foundational documents, assess competing constitutional arguments, and evaluate how public decisions shape social, economic, and political outcomes.

Primary Texts and Materials

- United States Constitution
- The Federalist Papers (selected essays)
- Selected decisions of the Supreme Court of the United States
- Contemporary legislative, executive, and policy documents

Course Structure

I. Political Theory and the Concept of Government

- The philosophical purposes of government: order, liberty, justice
- Social contract traditions (Hobbes, Locke, Rousseau)
- Democracy, republic, constitutionalism, and rule of law
- Rights, duties, and the concept of citizenship

Students will evaluate normative theories of authority and compare institutional models across political systems.

Students will analyze executive–legislative tension and the evolution of presidential power.

- Methods of constitutional interpretation (originalism, living constitutionalism, textualism)
- Federal court structure
- Landmark decisions shaping rights and federal power

Students will examine key rulings of the Supreme Court of the United States and evaluate competing interpretive methodologies.

VI. Elections, Parties, and Democratic Participation

- Electoral systems and representation
- Political party development and primary systems
- Voting rights jurisprudence
- Campaign finance and political accountability

Students will analyze turnout disparities, representation gaps, and structural strengths and weaknesses in American electoral design.

VII. Media, Information, and Public Opinion

- Constitutional foundations of press freedom
- Agenda-setting and framing effects
- Evaluating credibility and bias
- Social media and civic discourse

Students will critique how information flows affect institutional legitimacy and democratic decision-making.

VIII. Public Policy and Multilevel Governance

- Policy formation cycle: agenda, formulation, adoption, implementation, evaluation
- State and local governments as laboratories of democracy
- Fiscal federalism and regulatory authority
- Case studies in education, healthcare, or environmental regulation

Students will produce policy analyses assessing constitutional authority, administrative feasibility, and social consequences.

IX. Civil Liberties and Civil Rights

- First Amendment jurisprudence
- Equal Protection Clause and substantive due process
- Balancing liberty and security
- Historical expansion and contraction of rights

Students will examine doctrinal evolution and tension between individual autonomy and collective governance.

Students will design and defend a civic action proposal grounded in constitutional principles and institutional realities.
